General Polices

- The prospective student must have passed the previous grade with a satisfactory academic and behavioral level.
- A personal interview is conducted for each prospective student in addition to electronic placement tests in Math and English Language.
- Students must abide by the rules and regulations of the schools at all times. In case a student caused a problem or violated the schools' rules he/she is faced with a disciplinary penalty in accordance with the school policies which are issued by the Ministry of Education.

- Miscellaneous fees include student's insurance inside the school premises, insurance against school buses accidents, scientific labs, internal activities, using electronic services, stationary (notebooks, publication).
- Miscellaneous fees do not include books and uniform.
- Reserving a seat is (200 JDs) and is non-refundable and is considered a part of the annual tuition fees.
- Admission fees for new students is (200 JDs) and is non-refundable and is NOT considered a part of tuition fees.
- (300 JDs) are paid for each semester for the Learning Support Department for each subject.
- (300 JDs) are paid each semester for the Learning Support Department for Arabic Language for non-native speakers of Arabic.
- (13 JDs) additional fees are deducted as Cancer Insurance.
- Graduation Ceremony Fees: - 100 JDs /12th graders - 50 JDs / KG2 students
- The external Exams' fees for the British Program and the American Program are paid by the students on the time of exams' registration.
- General Secondary Certificate Examination (Tawjihi) fees are to be paid with accordance to the Ministry of Education rules and regulations.



Terms of Payment & Discounts

Terms of Payment

- First semester fees are due in full by Aug . 23rd ,2018
- Second semester fees are paid by a postdated cheque due on Feb. 28th, 2019 or before.
- Once all annual tuitions fees are paid in full by June 30th, 2018 an extra 10% discount is granted.
- Once all annual tuitions fees are paid in full between June 30th ,2018 and the first day of the first semester an extra 5% discount is granted.
- The Schools has the right to cancel all granted discounts if the due tuition fees are not paid in full on time.
- Any granted discounts are applicable on the basic tuition fees only.
- The student is considered officially registered when the due amount of tuition fees is paid to the Financial Department
